Overview of HB 581 Presented by Council Member Carla Coley:

- 1. Key Provisions:
- Provides statewide floating homestead exemption
- Limits property tax increases due to home value appreciation
- Includes optional sales tax to offset property taxes
- Implements procedural modifications for property tax assessment
- 2. Current Status:
- Passed in March 2024
- Signed into law April 2024
- Effective January 1, 2025
- 62.9% of Georgians voted in favor
- 3. HB 92 Updates:
- New bill introduced to address gaps in HB 581
- Changes definition of homestead to include 5 acres

- Allows surviving spouse to retain floating exemption
- Extends opt-out deadline to March 31, 2029

Ray Martin (172 First Avenue) spoke in favor of opting in, citing:

- Concern for retirees on fixed incomes
- Impact on community stability
- Discussion of rental property assessments
- Support for gradual funding increases
